



Element Fleet COVID-19 Safety Update

July 22, 2020

The following 41 states have provided updated information related to driver licensing. Disclaimer: All information provided is deemed reliable, but it is not guaranteed and should be independently verified.

- Alaska - DL's that expired during the pandemic period will remain valid until 7/30. Effective 5/11 requirement of out of state drivers to obtain an Alaska driver's license within 90 days of entering Alaska is suspended until 7/30.
- Arizona - Licenses that expire between 3/1-9/1 will have an extended expiration date of 180 days past the expiration date.
- California - Drivers under 70 with expiring DL's between March and July now valid through 7/31. Drivers 70 and over with expiring DL's will receive a 120-day extension with licenses that expired 3/1-7/31. All CDL's and CLP's expiring between March and June now valid through 9/30. This extension does not include medical certs. California is honoring all FMCSA waivers through 9/30 Services being offered at DMV offices include: CDL vehicle inspections and basic control tests.
- Colorado – Driver Control Front Office Cashiering Unit will reopen 7/20 for reinstatements, MV records, paying a ticket and DOT medical updates. Permitting counties to waive late fees for vehicle registration and renewals. This is in effect for the period of the Governor's emergency order. Customers are encouraged to online services or self-service kiosks to complete eligible transactions. Dealer title processing available via mail or FedEx.
- Connecticut - Driver's licenses, ID cards and learner's permits expiring between 3/10 - 6/30 extended 180 days. Driver's licenses, ID cards and learner's permits expiring between 7/1 - 7/31 extended 90 days.
- Delaware - Waiving late fees for vehicle registration and driver license renewals until further notice. Granting waivers based on FMCSA guidance for regulations applicable to CDL holders. Discontinuing all CDL downgrades due to an expired medical certificate until further notice. CDL holders have option to renew online and at self-serve kiosks and make an urgent appointment at open DMV locations.
- District of Columbia - DMV has extended the expiration date for all documents expiring March 1 through the duration of the public health emergency, including driver licenses, identification cards until 45 days after the health emergency concludes. All DL suspensions and revocations

paused until DC DMV returns to full operating capacity.

- Georgia- Most GA driver's licenses and ID cards with an expiration date between March 14, 2020, through June 30, 2020, received a 120-day extension. 120-day extensions for CDL. Med certs and CDL endorsements extended with CDL licenses.
- Hawaii - DL/IP/ID/State ID that expires between 3/16 thru 6/30 are granted an extension until 9/30. CDL's and CLP's that expire between 3/16- 7/31 are granted an extension until 9/30. They must meet requirements for a valid med cert.
- Idaho - CDL's and CLP's that expire between 3/1- 9/29 are valid until 9/30. DL's, Permits, ID cards 90-day extension for expirations between 3/1 and 5/31 (until 6/30 to renew).
- Illinois - All expired licenses and ID cards through 7/31 are valid until 11/1.
- Indiana - Continuing to issue DL and IDs. All customers who can renew their DL/ID outside of a branch are being asked to do so. Administrative penalty fees for expired DLs, Reg, Titles, etc. reinstated as of 7/1 after being waived since 3/13. CDL will not be downgraded due to expired medical cert. New titling and registration can be done through mail or BMV partner locations.
- Iowa - DLs issued to anyone at any age, the expiration date will NOT be enforced for any Iowa license expiring 1/16 and beyond. ANY Iowa driver's license with an expiration date of 1/16 through the declared disaster emergency. CDL & CLP expired 3/1 or later will be valid until 9/30. HME's expiring between 3/1 and end of disaster will be given a 180 extension. Most FMCSA waivers will be honored with the exception of knowledge testing by third parties and not needing to hold a CLP for 14 days. HME expiring between 3/1-7/31 valid for an additional 180 days.
- Kansas - All driver license renewals are extended to 60 days upon the expiration of the executive order.
- Maryland - Driver licenses, ID cards, permits and registrations that expire or are eligible for renewal will not expire until the 30th day after the state of emergency has been lifted. Select MDOT MVA branch offices open to customers by APPOINTMENT ONLY for select services. Customers with questions related to EMERGENCY BUSINESS NEEDS, like obtaining a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) or registering fleet vehicles needed to bring resources to Marylanders, should reach out to MDOT MVA at COVID19MVAAction@mdot.maryland.gov or 1-800-950-1682.
- Massachusetts - Driver's licenses and ID cards that expired or will expire 3/1-5/30 now expire in September 2020. Driver's licenses and ID cards that will expire in June have been extended until October 2020, those that will expire in July have been extended until November 2020, and those that will expire in August have been extended until December 2020.
- Michigan - DL's/CDL's/ID's expiring after 3/1 have until 9/30 to renew.

- Minnesota - DPS-DVS automatically extended expiration date for all DL/Permit/ID cards that expired between 3/13-8/31 until 9/30.
- Mississippi - All valid driver's licenses, learner's permits, and ID cards set to expire between 3/14 – 6/30 shall instead expire on 8/3.
- Montana - Extensions for all CDLs due to expire March, April and May remain valid for 90 days after expiration. HME extended 180 days if expiration 3/1-7/31 but must renew no later than 60 days before end of extension.
- Nebraska - All expired driver licenses, State IDs, and permits must be renewed by August 31, 2020 in order to remain valid.
- Nevada - All licenses, permits and ID cards expiring between 3/12- 7/15, you have until 9/13 to renew.
- New Hampshire - For licenses that are expired or expiring by 8/31, in-person driver license renewal appointments are available.
- New Jersey - All driver licenses, driver permits and non-driver IDs expiring before 5/31 have been extended to 7/31. Documents expiring in June or July are extended by two months.
- New Mexico - DL's expiring 3/11- 6/30 receive a 90-day temporary license emailed.
- New York - All licenses expiring March 1st or later will be extended until further notice.
- North Carolina - Credentials expiring between 3/1 – 8/1 have been given a one-time, five-month extension (from the original expiration date) to renew driver licenses and handle vehicle registrations. Any fines and fees related to expired credentials are being temporarily waived.
- North Dakota - DL's expiring 3/1 or after will remain valid until 8/31. CLP/CDL expirations have been extended until 8/31. Medical cards valid as of 2/29 extended until 9/30.
- Oklahoma – 30-day extension for all class D driver licenses, commercial licenses, and handicap permits that expired 30 days prior to the Governor's executive order notice. All extended expiration dates of class D driver licenses, state issued ID cards, handicap parking placards, commercial licenses and commercial learner permits will be considered expired after 6/30.
- Oregon - All DL's, permits and ID's expiration dates have been extended through 10/1. All CDLs & CLP's expiring between 3/1 - 9/29, now expire on 9/30.
- Pennsylvania - Driver Licenses, photo ID cards and learner's permits with expiration date between 3/16 - 7/31 are now extended through 7/31. For CDLs scheduled to expire from 3/16 – 5/31, the expiration date is now extended until 7/31. The expiration date of an HME for a Pennsylvania CDL holder who held a valid, unexpired HME with a determination of no security threat on or after 3/6, is extended until 7/31.

- Rhode Island - Driver's Licenses, and ID cards set to expire between 5/1-7/31 shall now expire 90 days from their expiration date. Driver's Licenses, including CDL, permits and ID cards set to expire between 3/1- 4/30 shall now expire 180 days from their expiration date.
- South Carolina - Waivers for CDLs based upon FMCSA guidance.
- Tennessee - All Class D, M, PD, PM and ID licenses and hand gun permits set to expire between 3/12 – 6/29 will be delayed to expire 11/15.
- Texas - Extensions granted for all card types for 60 days after state of disaster has ended.
- Utah - CDLs expiring ≥ 3/1 extended until 6/30. MEC expiring after 3/1 extended provided original cert valid for 90 days or longer.
- Virginia DL/ID Extensions credentials that expire on or before 7/31 is extended 90 days, but must be renewed by 8/31.
- Washington - DL's and LP's set to expire 3/1-6/30 will be extended 180 days. DL's and LP's set to expire 7/1-9/30 will be extended 90 days.
- West Virginia - All DLs, CDLs, instruction permits including Commercial permits and CDL med certs with an expiration date in March, April or May are valid until 8/1. All CDLs, instruction permits including Commercial permits and CDL med certs with an expiration date in March, April and May are valid until 8/1.
- Wisconsin - 60-day extension for both DLs and CDLs
- Wyoming – 90-day grace period for all DL/ID with expiration dates between 3/15 and 6/1.
