

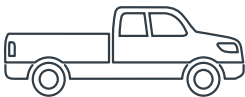
FLEET MANAGEMENT ▶ Truck Classification

TRUCK TYPE | WEIGHT CLASS



Class 1 Light Duty | Weight Rating: 6,000 lbs. or less

If a trailer is towed and the Gross Combination Weight Rating (GCWR) of the vehicle and trailer exceeds 10,000 lbs., the truck may require DOT compliance.



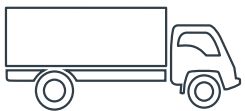
Class 2 Light Duty | Weight Rating: 6,001 to 10,000 lbs.

If a trailer is towed and the GCWR of the vehicle and trailer exceeds 10,000 lbs., the truck may require DOT compliance.



Class 3 Light Duty | Weight Rating: 10,001 to 14,000 lbs.

All trucks and vans from Class 3-8 require DOT compliance



Class 4 Medium Duty | Weight Rating: 14,001 to 16,000 lbs.

All trucks and vans from Class 3-8 require DOT compliance



Class 5 Medium Duty | Weight Rating: 16,001 to 19,500 lbs.

All trucks and vans from Class 3-8 require DOT compliance

Class 6 Medium Duty | Weight Rating: 19,501 to 26,000 lbs.

Class A Commercial Driver License (CDL) is required if pulling a trailer over 10,000 lbs. Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR).



Class 7 Heavy Duty | Weight Rating: 26,001 to 33,000 lbs.

Class B CDL is required to operate, and a Class A CDL is required if pulling a trailer over 10,000 lbs. GVWR.



Class 8 Heavy Duty | Weight Rating 33,001+ lbs.

Class A CDL is required if pulling a trailer over 10,000 lbs. GVWR and Class B CDL without the trailer.

CDL license classification requirements vary by state and in some cases local jurisdiction. It is very important to closely review the federal, state and local requirements to avoid compliance problems.
